



The 2020 Design Build Competition is moving online! We know we can't gather together to build Tiny Homes, Sheds, and Storage Structures in person this spring, but we have a great opportunity for industry and students to meet in the virtual classroom.

Beginning April 8th, 2020 you can log on and start competing. Below are the steps required:

1. Complete the student registration at www.designbuildcompetition.com. You will be asked if you have already completed OSHA 10 Training. If you select no, you will receive a follow-up email with instructions on how to complete your OSHA 10 Training online for free.

Items 2 through 7 will need to be submitted at one time. Please do not start submission until you have completed all items.

2. You will be asked to upload a photo of either your OSHA 10 Training card if you have already completed the training, or a copy of your certificate of completion if you complete it online through this competition.
3. You will be asked to submit a Resume. Don't have one? No problem. Join us on April 13th at 1:00 p.m. for a live webinar about how to build a resume. Can't make it at 1:00 p.m.? The webcast will be added to YouTube and can be accessed at any time.
4. Visit the student plan room accessible at www.designbuildcompetition.com and download the Tiny Home plans for this year's competition. An online tutorial will be held on April 14th at 1:00 p.m. and will be posted with detailed instructions on how to enter the plan room and download the plans.
5. Once you have your plans downloaded, you will need to complete a cost estimate for the structure and upload it to the website. In order to complete this cost estimate, you will need to summarize the materials needed based upon the plans, then visit www.HomeDepot.com or www.Lowes.com to price those materials online. In submitting your cost estimate, make sure to let us know which website you priced the materials from. A sample Cost Estimate is available online. A live webinar on Cost Estimating will be held online on April 17th at 1:00 p.m. and will be available on the website afterwards.
6. You will need to build a physical model of the exterior of the Tiny Home using **ONLY** materials that can be found inside your home. The materials might be used cardboard, folders, popsicle sticks, branches, styrofoam, etc. Creativity is essential. The size and scale of the model is up to you.
7. You will need to submit up to a 60 second video which states your name, school, grade level, and then shows your physical model from multiple angles. During your video, please point out which areas of actual construction you would anticipate would be the most challenging.

Remember, items 2-7 will need to be submitted online at one time, so please ensure you complete all items before starting the submission process.

Written Requests For Information (RFIs) must be submitted through the website at www.designbuildcompetition.com by Monday, April 27 at 5:00 p.m. Addenda (answers to all RFIs) will be emailed and posted to the competition website by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 28. **All applications must be submitted online no later than 5:00 p.m. on May 1, 2020.**

An online awards ceremony will be held at 12 noon on Thursday, May 7th. First Place will be awarded a \$2,500 Scholarship. Second Place will be awarded a \$1,000 Scholarship. Third Place will be awarded a \$500 Scholarship. Honorable Mention(s) may also be awarded. Judging will be completed by CIEF Staff and Industry Professionals.

In addition to the competition, students will have access to live weekday webinars with industry professionals from the built environment. Ask questions of architects, engineers, project managers, project engineers, corporate vice presidents, owners, and more. You can also participate in live virtual jobsite visits and ask questions about current construction projects. A calendar of all live webinars will be posted as they become available on our website and a recorded version will be available online at the conclusion of each live session.
